## Chinese Community Resource Guide

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### **Resource Guide Tip Sheet**

In case of emergency, please call 911 immediately.

#### 1. Refer to the guide:

You can identify agencies providing the services you need according to location, program description, and language capacity.

#### 2. Before you call the agency:

- a. Make sure to have important documents and a pen with you. The agency may need your insurance card, medication list, treatment record, etc.
- b. Write down why you are calling, what do you need, and any questions you may have.

#### 3. During the call:

- a. Be prepared that the person who answers your call does not speak Chinese. To access language interpretation services in Chinese, please tell the staff person "Cantonese" or "Mandarin" in English and wait for an interpreter. Often they will put you on hold. Do not hang up!
- b. Tell the staff member or interpreter the purpose you are calling. Take down the name of the person you spoke with and how and when he or she will get back to you.
- c. If you reach the agency's voicemail, leave a message slowly and clearly with your name and telephone number. Repeat your name and number twice.

#### 4. Follow up as needed:

If you do not hear back from the agency in two business days, call again.
